





The Unbreakable Bond of Community

When eight-year-old Tabitha began experiencing debilitating back pain in late 2020, her mom Christie was alarmed. Normally energetic and bubbly, Tabitha felt miserable enough to cancel an upcoming performance she'd been looking forward to. "That's how I knew she was really sick," Christie said.

On December 1, 2020, Christie received a phone call from school, concerned about Tabitha's continued discomfort. Her fears confirmed, Christie immediately took her daughter to the emergency room, the first step on a health journey that would span hundreds of miles over the next year.

When a flurry of testing revealed that Tabitha had acute lymphocytic leukemia (ALL), a cancer of the blood and bone marrow, Christie was in disbelief. As a preschooler, Tabitha had been misdiagnosed with leukemia - a traumatic experience that lingered with Christie for years. "I remember saying, 'You're wrong. You got it wrong." This time, however, the medical team assured her, the diagnosis was accurate.

To make matters worse, Tabitha contracted COVID before treatment could begin. Her fragile condition meant she needed to be transferred from Wyoming to Rocky Mountain Hospital for Children in Colorado immediately, without Christie. Though the separation was terrifying, Tabitha was placed in capable hands with a world-class medical team. Forced to leave Tabitha's three-year-old brother Carson behind, Christie drove through the night to meet Tabitha in Denver the next morning.

After nearly a month of in-patient treatment, including COVID quarantine for both Tabitha and Christie, the family was discharged to Brent's Place in time for Christmas. "Before I could panic about where we would stay, they had figured it out," Christie remembered. As Tabitha's treatments continued through 2021, her health improved, and the family began to process the life-altering circumstances they found themselves in. Christie in particular was struggling to find her footing, angry that her child was sick. Her experiences as a single parent navigating pediatric cancer were underscored by her distrust of a medical system that had misdiagnosed her daughter and caused lasting trauma.

But the supportive Brent's Place community rallied around her family, providing activities for the kids, weekly meal support, and assistance accessing supplemental resources. In partnership with Jason's Friends, a Wyoming-based nonprofit focused on supporting families facing childhood cancer, Christie could breathe another sigh of relief knowing that their Brent's Place stay, no matter how long, would not impact the family's finances.

As the months passed, Tabitha blossomed, taking music lessons, building friendships with other kids navigating similar healing journeys, and even performing a holiday song for the Brent's Place community. "She's been able to be her most authentic self here at Brent's Place," Christie observed. As she befriended other parents experiencing similar challenges, Christie, too, began to see things from a new perspective. Together, the family leaned in, experiencing the full impact of what makes Brent's Place a refuge for so many.

In early 2022, Tabitha's health had improved enough to return home. "We got out of a really bad place," Christie said, looking back at their medical journey, "and that's because of Brent's Place."

While we hope Tabitha's path forward is paved with dreams realized, we're honored to have walked alongside her and more than 300 other families in 2021. Our partnership with Jason's Friends and your continued support make this healing success story, and so many more, possible.






Brent Eley Foundation 2021 OPERATING REVENUE AND EXPENSES

(Excluding one-time contribution from Brent Eley Center, Inc.)




