On March 10, 2015 Kaylee had a cold, then it became a fever, then her vision began to skew, and then she began to have trouble walking. Numerous doctor visits were turning up few answers and no one seemed to be able to provide a solution as to why four-year-old Kaylee was declining with each passing week. Quickly, she lost the ability to walk, and soon her facial muscles seemed to stop working and Kaylee lost her smile. An MRI was scheduled for the first week in May, and a diagnosis no family should ever have to hear was delivered: Kaylee had a brain tumor. Things happened quickly from that point on; a central line was placed, treatment was scheduled, and radiation began May 27th. By July 9th, Kaylee began to be able to walk again, providing a glimmer of hope for Kaylee's parents, Heather and Richard.

Kaylee's mom, Heather, assumed they would commute the 2+ hour trip every day during Kaylee's treatment of high dose chemo. She had heard of Brent's Place from the other families on the oncology floor but thought surely others were in higher need than her family since they were only two hours away from the hospital. That all changed during a treatment plan visit with their doctor, who would only allow Kaylee to complete outpatient treatment if she was staying at Brent's Place. Kaylee's treatment plan of high-dose chemo and a bone marrow transplant meant she would be at high risk for infection, making Brent's Place, with its Safe-Clean environment and close proximity to the hospital, essential for Kaylee's recovery.



During discussions with the medical team, Heather quickly realized a Safe-Clean apartment was going to make a critical difference in keeping Kaylee healthier during her treatment, but she did not yet know how much more Brent's Place would provide. The apartment was wonderful because it gave Heather and Kaylee a home, but the activities, meals, and community programs became a lifeline for them. According to Heather, it was the camaraderie of the Brent's Place families that was life-changing: *"The most important thing for me was the community. All of us were in a fight for our kids lives and we were able to provide support for each other."* Kaylee loved coming down for the activities; she could not always keep up with the other kids, but just being a part of the commotion provided her with a kind of "therapy" as well as giving Kaylee and her Mom an escape from the fear and unknown.

Kaylee was able to head back home on January 1st. Her tumor is still present, but Heather is grateful for this past year of treatment and for Brent's Place. The family has created beautiful memories and found joy in getting to know the little things about Kaylee. Brent's Place is thankful for the many supporters and volunteers who helped make it possible to support this special family for the 156 days they lived at Brent's Place.

Letter from Sean:
An intro to Brent's Place Too

From the very beginning, Brent's Place has operated with a set of principles that Donn and Linda Eley put forth as Brent's Promise when creating Brent's Place. Put simply, at Brent's Place **we promise** to provide a home away from home for families that travel to Denver seeking a medical miracle for their child. When they enter our doors **we promise** to serve the entire family, **we promise** to provide safe clean housing close to the hospital, **we promise** to make them laugh, and **we promise** to understand their journey.

Each year during our annual open house, we re-commit to these principles and we look to the year ahead. This year, however, we are adding a new and exciting promise to the powerful list above. **We promise** to make room for even more families. Last year, Brent's Place served 115 patients and their families, operating at maximum capacity for the fourth year in a row. As I write this letter, more than 20 are in need of Brent's Place that are unable to stay with us. In 2015 we were unable to serve more than 50 families due to a lack of space.

This year, will begin to fulfill this new promise as we begin building a new home of hope and healing, Brent's Place Too. Our second safe-clean facility in Aurora will be located adjacent to the current Brent's Place, just blocks from the Anschutz Medical Campus. When complete, the new 21-unit building will double our capacity and enable us to serve

more than 200 families each year undergoing a bone marrow transplant or other severe forms of treatment for cancer and other immunocompromising conditions. To date, we have raised \$6 Million of our \$8 Million goal through generous gifts from our board, foundation and corporate partners and individuals. **We are now asking the larger Brent's Place family to join us in our efforts to raise the remaining \$2 Million so that we can open the doors to Brent's Place Too for families in need as quickly as possible.** We know that the need will only continue to grow, and we cannot fulfill our promise without you. As a friend of Brent's Place we ask that you thoughtfully consider how you, your family or your business can help make Brent's Place Too a reality. Brent's Place Too

When the doors to the very first Brent's Place opened over seventeen years ago, it was immediately clear that the need for our one-of-a-kind services would expand beyond the one location. Just ten years later, a second Safe-Clean facility was built to help an increasing number of families. This, our Aurora facility, filled quickly and propelled Brent's Place into the limelight as the industry leader in accommodations designed specifically for immunocompromised kids battling cancer. Today, once again, an urgent need for expansion has arisen.

As the Denver metropolitan area has become a first-tier medical hub for patients seeking specialized cancer treatments, the hematology and

oncology programs at Brent's Place partnering hospitals have grown. A recent Philanthropic Feasibility Study confirmed what these hospitals have long suggested: there is a desperate need for additional Safe-Clean accommodations to support the families only Brent's Place has the expertise to serve. Brent's Place was completely full throughout 2015, unfortunately however, more than 50 families were turned away last year because we simply couldn't accommodate them. We are currently able to serve just 40% of the housing needs of qualified immunocompromised patients in the Denver metro area, despite being the only hospital-recommended location for their recovery.

The best way to provide a home away from home for more families in desperate need of safe accommodations and a supportive community each year? Another new building, of course! The Brent Eley Foundation is thrilled to announce our plans to construct Brent's Place Too, a brand new Safe-Clean building adjacent to the current Aurora facility.

In keeping with our mission, Brent's Place Too has been designed with our residents' fragile immune systems and the integrity of the family unit in mind. It will feature 21 private two or three bedroom apartments that allow for isolation when medically necessary; community spaces for arts and crafts, holiday celebrations and shared meals; an innovative outdoor play space; and isolated air filtration systems that will help eliminate the spread of germs and protect against the everyday toxins that are so dangerous to our young residents. Most importantly, this exciting addition will double to 200+ the number of brave kids Brent's Place can serve each year and allow more families to remain together, creating memories that will last a lifetime, throughout the most difficult battle of their lives.

Brent's Place Too will be located adjacent to the existing Brent's Place facility in Aurora and include:



We are excited to begin welcoming families by 2017 and hope you will join us in this new adventure!

The day starts early for Brent's Place volunteers.

At 8am, the first volunteer arrives for the morning front desk shift. Brent's Place front desk volunteers are the friendly faces that greet our families as they come and go from the hospital, usually calling the hospital shuttle for them or helping answer questions about resources in Denver. Jerry, who has been volunteering for over 7 years as the Monday front desk volunteer says *"It is a privilege to serve the Brent's Place families in some small way. Supporting them and working with the wonderful staff is a great volunteer opportunity for me each week."* about his time serving the Brent's Place families.

On Thursdays at 10 am, Amy from Swallow Hill music school has arrived to lead the kids in a fun and therapeutic music class. Amy is a trained music therapist, so while the kids think they are just having fun strumming on a ukulele or pounding on a guitar, this gifted volunteer is helping them find joy and strength in music. After Music Class, Amy spends one-on-one time with any Brent's Place kid that wants to learn to



play an instrument. Levi (pictured here with Amy) counts down the days until his lesson, helping him look forward to something past his daily chemo or clinic visits.

The next front desk volunteer arrives at noon.

Afternoon front desk volunteers help out the office staff with so many daily activities, anything from sending mailings to helping organize the movie closet. Whether it is answering the door for donation drop offs, signing for packages, or entertaining a Brent's Place kid, these smiling and friendly faces are an integral part of the Brent's Place day.

By 4 pm, the first program volunteer has arrived.

Whether it is game night, movie night, or arts & crafts, the program volunteers arrive to provide some respite at the end of the day for the families.

Our kids love knowing that after a morning at the hospital, usually undergoing chemo, radiation, or tests, that they will get to return to Brent's Place for a fun game of bingo (with prizes!) or participate in an awesome art project. Derek once told his nurse that she better hurry because "he had plans back at Brent's Place and had to be there by 4pm for bingo!"



While all the excitement is happening, the Brent's Place kitchen is buzzing with the four to six meal volunteers who are creating a delicious dinner.

As one Brent's Place mom said, *"the meals are my support program, after a long day at the hospital and taking care of my child all day, knowing that we will have a hot and delicious dinner at night means I can focus on doing things like spending time with my family or taking a quick nap since I know I'll be up in the middle of the night to deliver medicine. Some days, looking forward to that dinner is what gets me through the day."*

New Program: Teen Support Activities



In 2015, Brent's Place served over 20 teenagers. Some of those were young adults facing life-threatening illness and some were siblings of kids going through treatment. No matter the reason that brought them here, the presence of more teenagers highlighted a need for programming designed especially for young adults. Thanks to our 2016 Social work interns, Anthony Wubben and Devin Traxler, Brent's Place is designing and implementing a new teen support program.

The young adult programming kicked off in March with a lunch and movie afternoon. All Brent's Place residents between the age of 13 and 20 were invited to attend a movie and lunch afterwards at La Sandia. When the day started the group of 6 teenagers were a little timid and quiet, but by lunch time they were laughing and goofing off together. For an afternoon "things felt normal" and the youth were experiencing something a little more similar to a typical activity for a teenager.

Brent's Place looks forward to continuing to support these wonderful young adults in a meaningful way and is exploring other resources and activities that can provide a moment or day of relief during their time at Brent's Place.


